



What Not to Plant in Manitoba Invasive Ornamental Plants in Our Region

Invasive plants are those that have been introduced to an ecosystem from somewhere else and, lacking natural checks on their spread, outcompete the local species. This can have a ripple effect on the entire ecosystem and biodiversity generally. Invasive *ornamental* plants are ones that have been introduced for decorative landscape purposes, usually via nurseries.

This list is drawn from various regional lists of weeds and invasive plants, with an emphasis on plants of landscape use or origin. The main sources were the online lists of the Invasive Species Council of Manitoba and the Manitoba government's "Declaration of Noxious Weeds in Manitoba" and "Aquatic Invasive Species Regulation" (web links below).

Unfortunately, Manitoba's Invasive Species Council has been inactive since about 2018, and the Manitoba noxious weed list is oriented mainly toward agriculture. Therefore the Manitoba lists were checked against lists from neighbouring provinces and states with similar Zone 3 or 4 climates, and any ornamental plants not already in the Manitoba lists were included here. The lists for Saskatchewan and North Dakota did not yield any additional species. Invasive species lists for Alberta, Northern Ontario, Minnesota, and Wisconsin did contain some species that should also be of concern to Manitobans, and these were included. At the end, a supplemental list of plants flagged as invasive in Southern Ontario (Zone 5) is also given, as they may become a concern with climate change.

Sources of information are noted in the table and documented at the end.

significant threat, must be eradicated without conditions. Tier 2 weeds must be managed according to the size of the infestation. Tier 3 weeds have to be controlled if the weed's uncontrolled growth or spread would have a negative impact on the economy, the environment or the well-being of residents near-by."
